☐ Summer STEAM Camp		
This is the fourth Summer STEAM Camp for Northern Lehigh School District.		
☐ The camp was supported by the Northern Lehigh Education		
Foundation and funding through an EITC Grant from Neff's National Bank and ESSER Grants.		
☐ The camp expanded to include students in grades 7 and 8 while adding two more instructors.		
☐ The total enrollment increased from 70 campers in 2021 to 85 campers in 2022.		
☐ Topics included plants, animals, engineering, aerospace, astronomy, kitchen science, and graphic design.		

		Guest speakers from the local area were a dentist, financial
		advisor, graphic designer, industrial packaging designer,
		veterinarian, accountant, and engineer.

		We had 14 students enrolled in the summer program for the middle
		school, and there was a mix of students who needed the program
		and students who wanted academic enrichment.
		We used an integrated approach to teaching and at the core of the
		thematic units were the topics of Greek and Roman mythology.
		The students read stories and then had to create their own stories
	_	and as a final activity, the students had to create a movie trailer
		about one of Greek mythology stories. They had to write the movie
		trailer and film it.
		In math and science, the students worked on Roman numerals and
		we also studied the local area.
		Mr. Hauser gave the students a detailed walking tour of Slatington
	_	and the students were excited about learning about their
		hometown.
		The students also learned about the local waterways and the fish
	_	that live in the waterways. We went fishing one afternoon and
		collected water samples from the river and the canal and the water
		was examined under the microscope. They learned the names of
		the fish that are native to the Slatington area.
		In the afternoon portion of the program, the students cooked food
	_	that the Romans and Greeks would have eaten. They learned basic
	Italian and the Greek Alphabet.
