This is the fourth Summer STEAM Camp for Northern Lehigh			
School District.			
The camp was supported by the Northern Lehigh Education			
Foundation and funding through an EITC Grant from Neff's National xBank and ESSER Grants.			
☐ The camp expanded to include students in grades 7 and 8 while adding two more instructors.			
☐ The total enrollment increased from 70 campers in 2021 to 85 campers in 2022.			

	Topics included plants, animals, engineering, aerospace,
	astronomy, kitchen science, and graphic design.
	Guest speakers from the local area were a dentist, financial
	advisor, graphic designer, industrial packaging designer,
	veterinarian, accountant, and engineer.

	school, and there was a mix of students who needed the program
	and students who wanted academic enrichment.
	We used an integrated approach to teaching and at the core of the

	about one of Greek mythology stories. They had to write the movie
	trailer and film it.
