Winter break has been going on for many years, but how long has it been actually going on for? Why did it even start in the first

schools closed, teachers and schoolmasters were unpaid!

tion can't make enough to fit the supply that they need. 
will have five Flexible Instruc-

According to the ASPCA, "close to one in five households acquired a cat or dog since the beginning of the COVID-19 crisis, which would account for approximately 23 million American households based on the 2019 U.S. Census. National estimates for pet adoption rates shown by the ASPCA state that approximately 6.3 million animals enter shelters throughout the nation each year. #### proximately 3.1 million dogs and

3.2 million cats. Since 2011 the amount of dogs and cats entering shelters has dramatically declined from 7.2 million to 6.3 million. The larger decline was in dogs from 3.9 million to 3.1 million dogs each year. Additionally, each year approximately 920,000 shelter animals are euthanized each year. Each year there are about 390,000 dogs and 530,000 cats euthanized. There has also been a dramatic decline in the number of euthanized animals from 2011. In 2011 there were 2.6 million animals euthanized. Part of the reason for the dramatic decline is due to adoption rates going up and the increase in the number of stray pets that get returned to their owners. 4.1 million shelter animals

are adopted each year. Approximately 2 million of the animals adopted each year are dogs and 2.1 million are cats. Around 810,000 stray animals that enter shelters get returned to their owners. 710,000 of these animals are dogs and 100,000 of the animals are cats. Statistics from ASPCA state that 34% of dogs get purchased from breeders and 23% of dogs and 31% of cats are obtained from an animal shelter or humane society. If you're looking for a new pet and want to help bring these statistics down, even more, adopt an animal from a shelter or humane society instead of going to a breeder. You may be saving an animal's life. Adopt—don't shop!



#### Materials

• 1 Winter-Related Figurine (needs to withstand glue and water)

• 1 Hot Glue Gun (can be substituted with a glue stick or glue bottle)

- 1 Container of Glitter
- (Preferably white or silver)
- 1 Pair of Scissors

• 1 Small Plastic Container (Preferably clear; I used the bottom of a plastic muffin container)

#### Instructions

1. Use your hot glue gun to glue the bottom of your figurine to the top of your small plastic container. Let it dry for a few minutes. Then, glue the bottom of the plastic container to the inside of your jar's lid. Let it dry for a couple of minutes.

2. While your lid is drying, fill your jar with the desired amount of clear glue. Note that the more glue you put into



8 ounces high-quality, semisweet chocolate (broken into pieces)

2 teaspoons canola oil, divided

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon peppermint extract, di-

vided

8 ounces high-quality, white chocolate (broken into pieces)

25 peppermints (crushed)

#### Directions

- 1. Lightly grease a 9x9 inch pan and line it with waxed paper, smoothing out the wrinkles; set aside.
- 2. Place the semisweet chocolate and 1 teaspoon of the canola oil in the top of a double boiler over the barely simmering water, stirring frequently and scraping down the sides with a rubber spatula to avoid scorching.
- 3. When the chocolate is melted, stir in <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon of the peppermint extract.



- 4. Pour the melted chocolate into the prepared pan, and spread evenly over the bottom of the pan.
- 5. Sprinkle half of the crushed peppermints over the chocolate layer.
- 6. Refrigerate until it's completely hardened; about 1 hour.
- 7. Place the white chocolate and the remaining 1 teaspoon of the canola oil in the top of a double boil over just barely simmering water, stirring frequently and scraping down the sides with a rubber spatula to avoid scorching.
- When the chocolate is melted, stir the remaining <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon of the peppermint extract.
- 9. Pour the white chocolate directly over the semisweet chocolate layer and spread evenly.
- 10. Sprinkle the remaining crushed peppermints over the top and gently press in.
- 11. Refrigerate until completely hardened; about 1 hour.
- 12. Remove from the pan and break into small pieces to serve! Enjoy!

#### **Ingredients for Cupcakes**

9 tablespoons unsalted butter, room temperature

 $\frac{3}{4}$  cup white sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 eggs

1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups sifted self-rising flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup milk

#### **Frosting Ingredients**

1 cup confectioners' sugar

1 tablespoon unsalted butter, room temperature

- 1 tablespoon milk
- 1 drop brown food coloring

#### **Decoration Ingredients**

- 6 vanilla wafer cookies (Such as Nilla)
- 12 red jelly beans
- 24 candy eyeballs

24 chewy chocolate-flavored candy (such as tootsie rolls)

24 pretzels

#### Directions

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease a 12-cup muffin tin or line cups with paper liners.
- Combine 9 tablespoons butter, white sugar, and vanilla extract in a large bowl; beat with an electronic mixer until smooth and creamy.
- Add eggs one at a time and beat until well combined. Fold in half the flour and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup milk and stir to combine. Repeat with the remaining flour and milk.
- Spoon the batter into the prepared muffin cups,
  filling about each <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> full. Bake in the preheated
  oven until a toothpick inserted in the center
  comes out clean; about 18 minutes. Remove tin
  from oven and cool for 5 minutes. Remove the
  cupcakes from the tin and cool them completely
  before decorating; about 1 hour.
- Combine confectioners' sugar, 1 tablespoon butter, and 1 tablespoons milk in a large bowl; beat with an electric mixer until smooth and creamy. Thin the frosting with a little milk or water, if necessary. Add food coloring and stir until the frosting is uniformly brown. Add more food coloring, 1 drop at a time, till it's the color you like.
- Spread a thin layer of frosting onto each cake. Break the vanilla cookies in half.
- Put 1 cookie half on each cupcake for the mouth. Use a bit of frosting to "glue" a jelly bean onto the cookie of the reindeer's red nose.
- Stick 2 candy eyeballs on each cupcake.
- Break off a piece of each pretzel so that they look like antlers and stick 2 on top of each cupcake. Shape chewy candies into ears and stick 2 on the sides on each cupcake.
- Enjoy!







Gingerbread Cookies

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup dark brown sugar packed
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 12 tablespoons butter
- 3/4 cup molasses (dark molasses)
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1. Add flour, brown sugar, baking soda, cinnamon, ginger, cloves and salt to a mixing bowl and mix.
- 2. Add the butter pieces and use a pastry blender to cut the butter in until the mixture resembles a fine meal.
- 3. With a mixer running on low speed gradually add the molasses and milk and mix until combined, about 30 seconds.
- Divide the dough in half, forming each into a ball. Wrap each in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2 hours or overnight, or place in the freezer for

about 20 minutes, until firm, if you're in a hurry.

- 5. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 6. Remove one dough sheet from the fridge/freezer and place on the counter. Roll out the dough (use a little flour on your rolling pin if needed), until it's about ½ inch thick. Cut gingerbread men and place them on prepared baking sheets.
- Refrigerate the gingerbread men for 5 minutes (meanwhile you can roll out the other dough ball).
- 8. Bake the cookies until set in the centers and the dough barely retains and imprint when touched very gently with fingertip, 8 to 11 minutes (depending on the size of your cookie cutter). Do not overbake!



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## Kyle Rittenhouse: What's Going On?

A lot of you have probably heard the name Kyle Rittenhouse being thrown around. Many readers may have heard about the man. However, a lot have probably heard mixed things relating to the name. The left despises the man. They deem him a white su-



premacist vigilante. On the other side of the spectrum, there ics the right, who praises the man for his actions. However, there are a few that are neutral on the situation, with some even not knowing what has happened. I'm going to try to explain what happened and give my personal opinions on some things relating to the shooting and the actions before the shooting.

Background

Kyle Rittenhouse is an eight-

een-year-old man who recently stood trial for the murder of two, and the injury of one. This happened during a riot in Kenosha, Wisconsin, after the shooting of Jacob Blake by police.

#### Jacob Blake

The shooting of Jacob Blake resulted after a warrant for his arrest was issued for sexual assault, trespassing, and connections with domestic abuse. During the encounter with police, he was tasered twice in his girlfriend's SUV. The attempts failed, and shortly after this, he stepped out of the vehicle. The officer that had responded reported Blake had been holding a knife as he exited the vehicle. The officer quickly attacked, firing seven rounds into Blake with his service pistol. Four had hit his back, which paralyzed him from the waist down.

#### The Kenosha Guard

The protests and general unrest in the area resulted in the formation of a local militia that would be known as the Kenosha Guard. A former alderman of Kenosha known as Kevin Mathewson posted a call-to-arms on Facebook on the 24th of August, attracting the attention of multiple people who went to protect local businesses. One of these people was Kyle Rittenhouse. He had said to a reporter that he was there to help protect businesses and help the injured.

#### The Shooting

The same day the militia assembled, Rittenhouse went to Kenosha from his home in Antioch. He had been using an AR-15 which was given to him by a friend named Dominick Black that was living in Kenosha. Rittenhouse went to stay at Black's house on the 24th. On the 25th, he had allegedly helped clean graffiti off of a school business. He went to protect a Car Source shortly before midnight. There have been mixed sources on this, but the business owners had claimed they never asked for assistance.

It was there he encountered a man known as Joseph Rosenbaum, a man Rittenhouse had previously been confronted by. He chased after him, and according to Rittenhouse, Rosenbaum had threatened to kill him. A bystander known as Joshua Ziminski fired into the air in an attempt to get the attention of the attackers and Rittenhouse.

Rittenhouse had turned around after hearing the shot, pointing his rifle at Rosenbaum to deter him. It was at this point Rosenbaum reached for the rifle Rittenhouse had been carrying. It was there Rittenhouse pulled the trigger, sending multiple shots into Rosenbaum. Rosenbaum died shortly after, with wounds to his heart and lung.

#### The Second Shooting

After the encounter, Rittenhouse retreated to some nearby police cars, followed by angered protestors. It was then an observer named Gaige Grosskreutz ran up beside Rittenhouse, asking what he was doing and if he had shot somebody. Eventually, the protestors caught up to Rittenhouse. He was hit by one, which resulted in him tripping. A man then ran up to him and kicked him while he was on the ground. Rittenhouse fired off two rounds to attempt to hit the attacker. However, he missed. Shortly after, Anthony Huber hit Rittenhouse with a skateboard and attempted to grab the rifle Rittenhouse held. After a while, Huber was able to grab hold of the gun and began pulling it towards him. Rittenhouse fired off one round, obliterating Huber's chest and heart. He also died later.

#### The Third Shooting

Gaige Grosskreutz had witnessed this shooting and had allegedly thought he was an active shooter. He ran up to Rittenhouse with arms up, but shortly after he grabbed a Glock from his concealed holster and aimed it at Rittenhouse. Rittenhouse shot one round at Grosskreutz, who severed most of his right arm. It was found out later that Grosskreutz had a carrying permit that had expired, meaning he was not allowed to conceal a firearm at all.

#### After the Shootings

Rittenhouse had turned himself in about an hour

after the shooting took place, and was held in juvenile detention until October 30th, 2020. He paid off This has been used by multiple far-right groups to his bail and was allowed release under the conditions he didn't consume alcohol, didn't possess any firearms, or associate with members of any discriminatory groups.

Rittenhouse had been using the "OK" hand sign. symbolize "white power." We are not sure if he had used the sign knowingly, or if he had been under the influence of alcohol during the picture. Regardless of the connotation, the left believes this gesture combined with the shootings will start making far-

#### The Trial

Rittenhouse's trial took place from November 1-19 of 2021 on the charges of attempted murder, murder, and recklessly endangering safety. There had

also been charges against him for illegally possessing a firearm. However, it was dropped as Winsconsin law only prohibits minors from possessing short-barreled rifles. After some great defense work from the prosecutor, and many hours of stress, Rittenhouse was acquitted on all of the charges against him.

right extremist groups more popular.

#### What the Right Thinks

A large portion of the Right thinks Rittenhouse had been helping the community by shooting the three men. They believe it's a great way to counter left-wing groups,

and stop civil unrest. Rittenhouse isn't a white supremacist in their eyes, but is instead "protecting the American way of life." They use the shooting as an example of "why the Second Amendment is necessary." This could be considered true. A rifle did help to protect Rittenhouse from injury or death.

#### Controversy

Response to the trial has been fairly mixed, and both sides entirely disagree with each other. We'll cover what the left and the right think about the situation. Afterward, I'll give my personal opinion.

#### What the Left Thinks

The left is terrified the shooting and

trial will empower white supremacists and vigilantes across the country. They are very upset because the distance between Antioch and Kenosha is over twenty miles. The Left also believes Rittenhouse is a white supremacist, which may be true. There have been pictures found of Rittenhouse posing with alleged members of the notorious Proud Boys group.



Conclusion

Regardless of anybody's beliefs, the Rittenhouse shootings and trials have hurt all parties involved. It has hurt the

family of Rittenhouse and the victims, all of whom are likely subject to constant harassment. Rittenhouse and Black will both have ruined reputations, alongside their families. It has divided the left and right further than ever. The only good things that have come out of the situation are the lessons we've been taught.

## **American Political Parties**

The American political system isn't something I'm really fond of. We have two parties, with different factions located within the party. For example, the Republicans have your typical moderate conservatives. However, they also have centrists, Christian conservatives, neoconservatives, and populists (similar to the Confederates). The issue here is that we have five factions in one party. They try to gain a majority over the others by spreading their ideas and before we know it we have politicians that change ideologies multiple times.

Then there's the multi-party system. It gives different politicians better chances of winning the elections. We'll look at Germany. Germany has the CDU/CSU, which stands as Christian Democrats. There's also the AfD, a far-right nationalist party. Ralph Brinkhaus, the leading figure of the CDU/CSU, may want to run for the next elections. Alexander Gauland may want to run as well. These two are in a situation like the Republicans. One remains moderate, the other remains radical. However, in this German system, there are two separate parties for these different groups, which allows both parties to run.

The nice thing about the American political system is that there are a ton of parties I've never heard of. Until I looked up "American Political Parties" a few months ago, I never knew there were more than three parties (Democrats, Republicans, Libertarians). It makes for some interesting discoveries about alternatives to the main parties and different ideologies. I'm going to briefly ("Briefly") explain and discuss things about some political parties in the US.

#### The Democrats

We'll start with the Democratic party. The Democrats are divided, although nowhere near as much as the Republicans. They have three main factions- modern liberals, social democrats, and centrists. I'll briefly explain each to you.

**Social Democrats**: The social democrats combine aspects of capitalism and socialism. They typically want to create a public sector in the economy to guarantee jobs for ones that won't be employed privately. They also plan to regulate the economy. They are also fond of



raising spending on welfare programs and paying for people's college education. They advocate rights for minorities. They are widely known as "progressives."

**Modern Liberals:** In the US, Modern Liberals are what we'll call the less extreme version of social democrats. Unlike the social democrats, modern liberals do not rely on public sectors at all, and instead just want to further regulate the economy. Similar to the social democrats, liberals like to raise spending on welfare, healthcare, and education. They also advocate for the rights of minorities.

**Centrists:** Centrist Democrats are also known as Third Way Democrats. They are still socially liberal on many issues but remain moderate or conservative economically. Some want to preserve the current regulation, while others want to further deregulate the economy. Most still want to protect the rights of minorities.

Here are some trends I've found across most/the entire party.

Preserving/Advancing current regulation.

Increasing the size of the federal government.

Allocating more power to the federal government and less to the states.

Advancing the rights of minorities.

Opening up the border.

Regulating the market.

Furthering gun control.

Allowing abortion.

Expanding worker's rights & raising the minimum wage

#### The Republicans

The Republicans are the "right party" in the political system. They have multiple factionsconservatives, centrists, neoconservatives, paleoconservatives, and national populists. Like the Democrats, here's a brief explanation of each faction.



National Populists: National populists are widely considered to be the radicals of the party. Most are against immigration and want to further restrict/eliminate it. Populists can be mixed economically. Some may be similar to third-way Democrats, while others may be entirely in favor of unregulated capitalism.

**Conservatives:** Baseline conservatives are your typical Republican. They typically advocate preserving the current American way of life. They are typically in favor of deregulating the markets and eliminating the power of trade unions. Many want to lower social spending and funding the military in the name of a concept known as "peace through strength."

**Neoconservatism:** Neoconservatives are arguably an extension of the main conservative base. They advocate peace through strength while staying active in international affairs. They split off from the rest of the conservative base after the Vietnam War. This is primarily because most conservatives wanted to leave Vietnam, where most neoconservatives wanted to stay.

**Paleoconservatism**: Paloeconservatives want to decentralize the government. They support economic nationalism and isolationism. Many would like to impose more trade tariffs and return to a traditional society. They differ from neoconservatives because they support republicanism and oppose free trade. The alt-right(A far-right white nationalist movement) stems from populists and paleoconservatives.

**Centrism:** Centrist Republicans support a mix of social equality and social hierarchy, combining left and right-wing politics to make common-sense decisions. They typically support market economies while maintaining government control to protect the public interest.

Here are some trends I've found between all/some fac-

tions in the Republican party.

They support a return to a traditional society.

They support free markets.
Many are against abortion.
Many believe religious institutions should be put back into the government.
Many are nationalists.

Many support restrictions on immigration. Many want to raise spending on the military. Many want to decrease social spending and taxes.

Here, I'll give some short descriptions about some third parties.

**Libertarians:** The Libertarians want to limit the role of the government as much as possible, by removing all activity in the economy other than funding the courts, the military, and the police. They support unregulated capitalism and non-aggression principle, an idea that says anything aggressive is immoral.

**Greens:** The Greens are divided, similar to the Republicans. There are communalists( A form of libertarian communism), social democrats, democratic socialists, and ecosocialists. However, they all share something in commonthey prioritize solving environmental issues over anything.

**Party for Socialism and Liberation**: The PSL is a communist party with Marxist-Leninist ideals. It wants to centralize the economy and save the country from the "dirty grip of capitalism."

**Constitutionalist Party:** The Constitutionalists consist almost entirely of paleoconservatives (See Republicans), with some populists thrown into the mix as well.

Of course, there are other parties. However, if we were to get too far into it like last time we'd take up six pages (Sorry, Mrs. Dunham!). Regardless, it's very important to learn about our politics, so we know what to vote for and what to do. These parties have the opportunity to impact the way we live in its entirety, so deciding what to follow is crucial to getting the most out of our lives. By Lacey Groover Team 8 Barker

After that breathe out for 4 seconds, then hold it there for, you guessed it, 4 seconds. Now do that 4 times. This exercise is called box breathing and it helps me so much when it comes to taking a minute to recognize and be mindful (haha) of my surroundings.

I also picked up some new hobbies, one of them is knitting. It's so nice and therapeutic. I used these two <u>videos</u> <u>to help</u> me learn. I'm currently knitting a mini scarf for one of my plushies because I'm still a beginner, but I'm still proud of it so far. I recommend getting knitting needles and yarn because I feel like anyone could enjoy it. Drawing random shapes with gel pens (or any type of colored writing utensil) is really mindless and fun to focus on. It doesn't make you stressed or have to focus too hard on what you're doing, and it makes such a cool effect if you finish it. You can see me using this pattern in the background of my mushroom drawing.

Last but not least, meditation. Yes, I know what you're thinking "Oh, God, she's a hippie!" You're not wrong, but you should seriously try this. Look up videos online and try to feel calm and in touch with your body and breathing.

Being mindful is a good thing to focus on every once in a while to make you feel content with yourself and your emotions. It's important to focus on your mental health and try and calm down when you have the chance while you're not in a panicked mood, so you can know how to cope at the moment when panic does happen.

"People say mental health is like physical health, you're not completely wrong, but you're definitely not right. Telling someone "You're not really sick; it's all in your head." is like telling someone with asthma, "You're fine; it's all in your lungs." The brain is an

organ that can have an issue like any other organ. It's like treating someone with a common cold the same way you treat someone with cancer; it doesn't work."

"There are many different ways to seek help. Talk to a professional, trusted adult, or just a friend. Working on things is something very hard to do on your own, so seek help in another way. If someone isn't listening, don't be afraid to talk to someone else about things. Although going through this experience was awful, it is better than hurting yourself in any way. If you are having these feelings, just know that you are definitely not alone, and they won't last forever. The experience that I had was "the bottom of the barrel" and it is not what happens instantly if you have these feelings. I didn't know what to do in the beginning and let it get worse for months, so seeking help is something right to do. If you are having feelings like this, just know you are not the only one." "I am still working through things by having weekly therapy and talking to people I trust. Taking steps forward does come with taking steps back, and that's totally okay! I'm working on accepting myself for who I am and building who I am as a person. This situation does not define me, and things will get better."


## Video Game Review: What Should YOU Buy for the Holidays?



-Feel Good -Inclusion -Teen Reads Wonder is an uplifting book about a kid



-TeenReads -Mythology -Inclusion This is part of a series about modern Greek half-bloods. It is my favorite book of this series, as it has more time with







## 22 Kill Push Up Challenge and Donation to Front Country Foundation

This year, 8th-grade history teacher Mr. Herzog and 22 8th-grade students participated in the 22 Kill Push Up Challenge. The Veterans Administration released a Suicide Data Report that found an average of 22 veterans die by suicide every day. The 22KILL initiative started in 2013, at first just as a social media




