SPECIAL BOARD REPORTS

<u>Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit</u> – Mr. Donald H. Dengler reported two new members joined the Board of Directors, one from Southern Lehigh and one from Whitehall-Coplay. They also had a tribute to an employee who had passed away.

Lehigh Career and Technical Institute – Mrs. Lori H. Geronikos reported LCTI Financial and Compliance Audit was clean. She further stated that state funding while favorable for school districts was not for LCTI. Money was taken away from LCTI and given to school districts. She stated that there is going to be a 5.81% increase this year at LCTI but in future years the increase will be much more. Law dictates that LCTI's fund balance is based on the size of the school. Currently LCTI can only have a fund balance of \$250,000. Fund balance is normally used as insurance incase something goes wrong. They are not allowed to have a large fund balance so therefore they must rely on the districts to keep them going financially. She feels this is the last year that district's will see an increase from LCTI as little at 5.81%. She stated that Northern Lehigh had many winners at the Skills USA Competition.

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<u>Legislative Report</u> – Mr. Gregory S. Williams stated that the Governor will be presenting his final state budget tomorrow at 11:30. He stated he read a recent article from a Minnesota Governor stated that state administration is looking into and considering withholding nearly 1 billion dollars in state aide payment to school district for education basically to use as cash flow for the state so they do not have to borrow money or raise taxes. They will withhold the subsidy payment for education which will cause school districts to use their reserve to operate. He is concerned with the state currently using federal stimulus money in the state budget and what will happen in two years when the federal stimulus money is gone.

Ms. Taylor Trapp and Mr. Justin Molitoris distributed their written student representative report and verbally reported on its contents.

Solicitor's Report – Attorney Charles Stopp reported that Lehigh County Commissioners asked the county solicitor to invite all school district and municipal solicitors to attend their meeting on the topic of tax assessments. The purpose of the meeting was to announce a change in the counties procedure. Previously, if a tax payer would file an appeal claiming their assessment was to high the county would take the lead. Once they were done evaluating the claim they would contact the school district, township or borough with the proposed settlement. The county is feeling the pressure fiscally as is everyone else. He suspects they are changing their procedures to export some of the cost back to the district and municipalities. The county has announced that they will try to negotiate settlements in the beginning. If the county does negotiate settlements, they will send out a bill based upon the relevant millages. He senses they may not put as much effort into it as they have in the past. The county is overwhelmed with appeals currently. Northern Lehigh had a hand full of assessment appeals last year. In the unusual event where there are numerous tax assessment appeals and the school board would like to take charge of the appeals, they can. The county will still be available for information but the county solicitor will not be involved.

<u>Federal and Other Programs Update</u> – Mrs. Karen A. Nicholas talked about tomorrow night's How to Study Workshop. She also talked about the new Standards Align System. It is a portal on the PDE website that allows teachers to look at standards, assessment, curriculum, framework, materials, resources and more.

Business Manager's Report – Mr. Jeremy G. Melber distributed the Single Audit Report ending June 30, 2009, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Performance Audit Report, 2010-2011 LCTI General Fund and Academic Center Budget and the 2010-2011 LCCC Operating, Debt Service and Capital Expenditures Budget. Mr. Melber stated that Mrs. Geronikos talked about the

Mr. Michaels talked about Race To The Top. He stated that it looked good on paper but would cost us more money in the long run and would not help us educationally. The Board of Education

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unanimously decided not to sign onto that program. The superintendent and the teacher's association also did not sign onto the program. He further stated that we have great teachers and an excellent administrative team and he thinks the Race To The Top is not the way to go for our district. He thanked them all for their unified approach to this program.

Mr. Hartman stated that the board was in executive session prior to tonight's regular school board meeting to discuss personnel issues.
