Student Representatives to the Board Report

<u>Solicitor's Report</u> – Attorney Charles Stopp stated that there are bonds that will need to be signed approved this evening.

Federal and Other Programs Update – Mrs. Karen A. Nicholas stated she is currently working on the PA Pact Grant. Needs to be submitted by the end of the week. PA Pact Grant consists of ABG, EAP and BEF. The amount of money we will receive for the ABG is the same for next year. The EAP is at a deficit of \$2,000.00. THE BEF grant pays for our Slatington Elementary tutoring, summer reading program and our intervention coordinator. The BEF grant is at a deficit of \$154,399. She has been in contact with the principals and teachers that are affected by this grant and they all have been very helpful in working out how we are going to run these programs with such a large deficit in funding for next year. The principals have also been contacted concerning foresight testing. She spoke with both the middle school and Slatington Elementary principals and they have both informed her that the foresight scores are higher than they were at this time last year. All building principals are having a very positive feeling on the PSSA scores this year. Lastly, Jose Avila and Noah Freudenberger, two of our tech wizards at Slatington Elementary, will be traveling to Dickinson College on May 26 to compete at the state level in graphic design.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Michaels stated, as Mrs. Nicholas has stated, again we will not be receiving money from the state that we received in the past. The community has been asking him if the district will be getting rid of any of our current programs. He stated that currently the answer is no but he can not answer what is going to happen in two or three months. He stated that notices have been sent out that districts should be cautious when it comes to budgeting. He stated that now is not the time to panic but to stay vigilant and pay attention to everything that is happening at the state level.

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Mr. Michaels stated that May 2-8. 2010 was National Teacher Appreciation Week. Teachers all sent a nice card and a small gift of our appreciation.

Mr. Michaels reported that he and Mrs. Nicholas have been meeting with the senior class officers to discuss graduation.

Mrs. Geronikos stated that she feels everyone's life is very busy but she wants to encourage all board members to attend graduation on June 18, 2010.

<u>Business Manager's Report</u> – Mr. Jeremy G. Melber stated the bond resolution is on the agenda this evening for approval.
